

*'Wild' about Wildflowers Drawing Competition
Terms and Conditions*

1. 'Wild' about Wildflowers competition (Competition) is run by Woodmeadow Trust (a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) registered with the Charity Commission in England and Wales Number 1151831), Little Annexe, Escrick, York, YO19 6EA.
2. The Competition is open to residents of the United Kingdom, except for those who are related to the judges of the Competition, those that are subcontracted to work for Woodmeadow Trust or anyone else associated with this Competition.
3. All information detailing how to enter this Competition forms part of these terms and conditions. It is a condition of entry that all rules are accepted as final and that the competitor agrees to abide by these rules. The decision of the judges is final, and no correspondence will be entered into. Submission of an entry will be taken to mean acceptance of these terms and conditions.
4. The competition has three age group categories:
 - Under 10
 - Aged 10 to 16
 - Aged 16 and over
6. Only one entry per person.
7. To enter this competition, you must produce a botanical hand drawing of a native wildflower. The wildflower can be growing in your garden or nearby outdoor space. If you do not have access to a garden, then dig out your wildflower or nature guidebook, or search the internet and draw your favourite native wildflower. The drawing should pay particular attention to the parts of a flower i.e. the stigma, petal, stamen, anther, stem and sepal (where applicable). The drawing can be produced in pencil (grey or coloured), drawing pens and watercolour paints and should be on a piece of A5 portrait paper. To enter your drawing into the competition, you should take a photograph of your drawing and email it to enquiries@woodmeadowtrust.org.uk and add 'Wild about Wildflowers' to the subject line. We will acknowledge your entry by email. Please keep your original drawing as the winning entries will need to post their drawings to our designers. Entries must include the following information:
 - First name and surname, or parent/guardian's first name and surname (if aged under 16)
 - Address or parent/guardian's address (if aged under 16)
 - Telephone number or parent/guardian's telephone number (if aged under 16)

- Email address or parent/guardian's email address (if aged under 16)
 - Age of child or adult
 - A title of your drawing (if applicable)
 - The name of the wildflower and its Latin name (if you are able to)
 - The location of wildflower if in your garden/outside space.
8. By providing your details you agree to be contacted by Woodmeadow Trust. We will treat your data with respect and you can **unsubscribe** at any time. You can find further details in our **privacy policy**.
 9. All entries must be received by midnight on Sunday 30th August 2020.
 10. All drawings submitted must be the work of the individual on whose behalf the entry is submitted.
 11. Copyright of all drawings submitted for this competition remains with the respective artist. However, each drawing grants a worldwide, irrevocable, perpetual licence to Woodmeadow Trust for use of their entry in printed or digital media for a period of no more than five years and the artist will always be credited.
 12. Late, illegible, incomplete, defaced, or corrupt entries will not be accepted. No responsibility can be accepted for lost entries and proof of transmission will not be accepted as proof of receipt. Entries must not be sent through agencies or third parties. Woodmeadow Trust reserves the right to disqualify any entry which it believes, in its sole opinion to be offensive or otherwise inappropriate, not in the spirit of the Competition or that infringes these terms and conditions.
 13. The winning entries will be those that are judged to be the most visually appealing. If you are a winner, you will be notified by email before Sunday 13th September and you will be given details of how to send your drawing to our designers.
 14. Each age category has one overall winner. The winning drawing from each category will have their design made into a greeting card which Woodmeadow Trust will sell to raise money for charitable purposes. Each winner (3 overall winners – 1 from each category) will receive a packet of the winning greeting cards (3 cards in one packet).
 15. All prizes are non-transferable.
 16. Events may occur that render the Competition itself or the awarding of the prizes impossible due to reasons beyond the control of Woodmeadow Trust and accordingly at its absolute discretion vary or amend the promotion and the entrant agrees that no liability shall attach to Woodmeadow Trust as a result thereof.
 17. English law applies, and the exclusive jurisdiction of the English Courts shall prevail.
